





ue their journey to Tortola, they traded the **Grand Banks** for a **42' Kadey Krogen** trawler, which was a more comfortable live-aboard boat equipped with freezer, washer, dryer, ice maker, and many extras that made cruising a lot more comfortable.

Venezuela

When the **Krogen** was ready for long range cruising, they headed once more for the **British Virgin Islands**, intending to return to Tortola for a job at

The Moorings. However, along the way they decided to continue their cruising lifestyle. They cruised through the islands of the Caribbean, ending in Venezuela. That journey took four and a half years. It was then they decided to head back to the states, replenish their funds, and work towards retirement. The journey back to Florida took two months.

Returning to the states, Ft. Lauderdale was quite a shock for Donna. There was all this talk about computers and floppy discs. While still


Terry is happily partnered with Barbara Keener. For socializing, he likes nothing better than rubbing elbows with his fellow Americans.
