
everyone has an opportunity to be involved in what we do, and that we

### **Member Profile**

## J. Richard (Dick) Weichman

J. Richard (Dick) Weichman was born in June, 1932, in Camden, NJ. He grew up and attended Gram-

mar School in Brooklawn, NJ, High School in Gloucester City, NJ, and Temple University in Philadelphia, PA, where he majored in Business Administration.

Dick was married to his wife Joan for 59 ½ wonderful

years until she passed in 2012. He has been partnered with Donna Savage of Homosassa, FL, for 6 ½ wonderful years. His daughter, Christine Reining, lives in Brooksville, FL. Dick has five grandchildren located in New Jersey, Pennsylvania, and St. Thomas, along with four great grandkids.

Dick served in the U.S. Army from 1952 – 1954 and was with the Army's 5th Regimental Combat Team in Korea. He was employed by the Campbell Soup Company in Camden, NJ, for 43 years. Dick started at Campbell Soup as a messenger, worked into the Accounting and

I.B.M. Departments, and was transferred to Campbell's Napoleon, Ohio, plant, working there from

1957 to 1968.

He returned to Campbell's World Headquarters in the Logistics Department in Camden, NJ, where he retired as Director, Computer Systems Development, North American Division in 1994.

After retirement,
Dick and his wife Joan moved to
the Heather, in Weeki Wachee, FL.
They joined HBYC in 1994 when
they brought their boat to Florida
from Chesapeake Bay, MD. Dick
lived in the Heather until 2013,
then moved to Sugar Mill Woods in
Homosassa, FL.

Dick served as Commodore, Hernando Beach Yacht Club and President of the Heather Golf and Country Club. He is a life Member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, the American Legion, and the Korean War Veterans Association. He has served on the HYBC Board for 14 years and has held many positions at HBYC.

Dick and Donna love to travel and intend to contiue doing so while still physically able. Recent trips have been to South Korea, China, Mexico, Austria, Germany, Netherlands, and Sweden, as well as many trips within the U.S.A

### Korean War

The Korean War, 1950 – 1953, began when North Korea attacked South Korea.

Dick Weichman served during the Korean war with the U.S. Army's 5th Regimental Combat Team, which was a self-supported army regiment with its own tanks, artillery, and infantry. Dick was in Korea the day the cease fire took effect at Panmunjom. His position was north of the DMZ's current location in the center of Korea.

Dick said that the last man killed in the Korean War, a Sgt. Cross, was in his Company. Sgt. Cross was in a bunker that took a direct hit from an artillery shell at 8 pm the day of the cease fire. The Korean War ended two hours later at 10 pm.

## **Charles Frederick Willett** 11/27\_ to 12/24/2019

HBYC Life Member and twotime Past Commodore Fred

Willett passed away in Maryland December 24th.

Fred served in the U.S. Navy during World War II, in the Pacific theater, commanding an LST (Landing Ship Tank). An LST is a large ocean-going warship, 328 feet long with a 50 foot beam. It could

carry 3,880 tons of cargo, such as tanks, vehicles, or troops (as many as150 troops).

Its armament included a 40 mm czannon mounted on the ship's prow, six 20 mm guns, two 50 caliber machine guns, and two mortars.

As he wished, his ashes will be sent to Norfolk where they will be taken out and deposited in the Ocean.
