
Club Members Wet Their Whistles

Plenty of cocktails were poured at HBYC's April 28th Bartending Seminar led by **HBYC Vice Commodore (and Bar & Kitchen Manager) Susan Myers**. But it was for practice only and the drinks were water mixed with water.

Some knowledge from the seminar:

- There are only seven kinds of booze Bourbon, Gin, Rye, Rum, Scotch, Tequila, and Vodka. From these, all cocktails are made.
- The taller the glass, the weaker the drink. Ice is your friend. The less ice, the weaker the drink.
- When pouring, hold the bottle at the base of the neck with the heel of your hand. Count to 4 for one shot, to 2 for a half shot.
- Martinis, Manhattans, and Rob Roys are made and served the same way, "Straight Up" or "On the Rocks", either crackling cold, shaken, or stirred.

Less Vermouth makes a drier cocktail. Always pour the Vermouth first. For a really dry Martini, just shake the Vermouth bottle near the Gin or Vodka bottle so that the Gin or Vodka spies the Vermouth. Just a glimpse will do.


